

Contraindications To Taking NSAIDs

1. Kidney disease (GFR < 60 ml/min)
2. Hyperkalemia
3. Duodenal or gastric ulceration
4. Poorly controlled hypertension
5. Moderate to severe uncompensated heart failure
6. cirrhosis of the liver
7. Drug interactions (e.g. anticoagulants)
8. NSAID allergy
9. Increased risk of a GI bleed
 - a. Prolonged NSAID treatment
 - b. History of peptic ulcer or GI bleed
 - c. age >65
 - d. concurrent use of Aspirin or glucocorticoids
 - i. patients at increased risk may require a PPI
