## Contraindications To Taking NSAIDS

- 1. Kidney disease (GFR < 60 ml/min)
- 2. Hyperkalemia
- 3. Duodenal or gastric ulceration
- 4. Poorly controlled hypertension
- 5. Moderate to severe uncompensated heart failure
- 6. cirrhosis of the liver
- 7. Drug interactions (e.g. anticoagulants)
- 8. NSAID allergy
- 9. Increased risk of a GI bleed
  - a. Prolonged NSAID treatment
  - b. History of peptic ulcer or GI bleed
  - c. age >65
  - d. concurrent use of Aspirin or glucocorticoids
    - i. patients at increased risk may require a PPI

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
