## Johnson and Strom Classification of PTTD

## • Stage 1:

- Tenosynovitis, but tendon remains functional
- Pain/swelling along the course of the PT tendon
- Preservation of the medial arch of the foot

## • Stage 2A:

- PT tendon elongates and starts to degenerate
- Forefoot abduction
- Flexible deformity
- Stage 2B:
  - Similar findings in 2A with the addition of lateral subfibular impingement pain and sinus tarsi pain
- Stage 3:
  - Subtalar arthritis is seen radiographically
  - unable to perform single-heel raise
  - flatfoot deformity with rigid forefoot abduction and hindfoot valgus
- Stage 4 (added by Myerson):
  - Progression of the deformity with valgus tilting of the talus and ankle joint involvement, leading to ankle arthritis
  - Ankle with valgus talar tilt due to deltoid ligament compromise
  - Similar findings to stage 3 of the foot

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
